A Major Change of Public Opinion In the Muslim World

Results from a New Poll of Indonesians



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Executive Summary

In the first substantial shift of public opinion in the Muslim world since the beginning of the United States' global war on terrorism, more people in the world's largest Muslim country now favor American efforts against terrorism than oppose them.

This is just one of many dramatic findings of a new nationwide poll in Indonesia conducted February 1-6, 2005, and just translated and released.

In a stunning turnaround of public opinion, support for Osama Bin Laden and terrorism in the world's most populous Muslim nation has dropped significantly, while favorable views of the United States have increased. The poll demonstrates that the reason for this positive change is the American response to the tsunami.

Key Findings of the Poll:

- For the first time ever in a major Muslim nation, more people favor US-led efforts to fight terrorism than oppose them (40% to 36%). Importantly, those who oppose US efforts against terrorism have declined by half, from 72% in 2003 to just 36% today.¹
- For the first time ever in a Muslim nation since 9/11, support for Osama Bin Laden has dropped significantly (58% favorable to just 23%).
- 65% of Indonesians now are more favorable to the United States because of the American response to the tsunami, with the highest percentage among people under 30.
- Indeed, 71% of the people who express confidence in Osama Bin Laden are now more favorable to the United States because of American aid to tsunami victims.


The Terror Free Tomorrow poll was conducted by the leading Indonesian pollster, Lembaga Survei Indonesia, and surveyed 1,200 adults nationwide with a margin of error of ± 2.9 percentage points.

Critical Implications

- The support base that empowers global terrorists has significantly declined in the world's largest Muslim country. This is a major blow to Al Qaeda and other global terrorists.
- U.S. actions can make a significant and immediate difference in eroding the support base for global terrorists.


- The United States must sustain its relief and reconstruction efforts in Indonesia in order to prevent the support base from rebounding.
- The size and strength of the support base can dramatically change in a short period of time. This is a front in the war on terrorism where the United States can continue to achieve additional success.

Background

Terror Free Tomorrow is a not-for-profit organization whose mission is to promote a new strategic framework to defeat global terrorists by undermining the support base that empowers them. Senator John McCain, 9/11 Commission Chairs Lee Hamilton and Thomas Kean, former Senator Warren Rudman, Congressman Dan Burton and others have endorsed the organization.

The last publicly released polls on these topics in Indonesia occurred in 2002 and 2003.² The Terror Free Tomorrow poll was conducted by the Lembaga Survei Indonesia (LSI), or the Indonesian Survey Institute, a highly respected, non-partisan public opinion research firm in Indonesia. It was conducted February 1-6, 2005 as a nationwide poll that included 1,200 respondents with a margin of error of 2.9%.

LSI has a strong track record of high quality and accurate polling. Indeed, LSI's election polls were the most accurate of all Indonesian pollsters. During the 2004 Indonesian elections (legislative and round one and two of the presidential elections), the LSI survey results were virtually the same as the actual election results. In the legislative election, LSI was able to predict the political parties' votes with a margin of error of only 1.64%. In the first round of the presidential election, LSI also correctly predicted that the SBY-Kalla team and the Megawati-Hasyim team would win. The LSI poll on the second round of the presidential elections was also accurate. The LSI survey results not only predicted that SBY-Kalla would win the election, but also accurately predicted the actual vote percentage with a margin of error of only 3.75%.

Methodology

Field data for this survey was collected February 1-6, 2005. This national sample (including Aceh and Papua) consists of 1,200 respondents selected through the multistage random sampling method. However, only 1,191 respondents were successfully interviewed.

The population was initially stratified based on the population of each province throughout Indonesia, thus obtaining samples in proportional numbers on each of the provinces. The second step of stratification was classification based on the area of domicile: urban and rural, of which the proportion is 42% urban and 58% rural. In addition, stratification was also conducted on the population proportion based on gender: 50% male and 50% female.

Following stratification, the *rural* (rural villages—the smallest administrative area) or *kelurahan* (urban village) were selected as the primary sampling unit (PSU), and systematic random sampling was done on the villages (urban or rural) selected in each province according to its respective proportion of population. There were 150 rural and urban villages selected randomly, including 87 rural villages and 63 urban selected at random systematically. From these primary sampling units, eight respondents were selected, totaling overall in 1,200 respondents participating in the survey. The number of samples was determined to account for approximately \pm 2.9% margin of error with 95% reliability.

² The Pew Research Center commissioned these surveys, which were "predominantly urban." The Terror Free Tomorrow poll was nationwide. In the Terror Free Tomorrow poll, there were no meaningful distinctions between urban and rural respondents.

In each selected village, all *Rukun Tetangga* (RT—the smallest neighborhood unit) were listed, and then four RT were selected at random. In each selected RT, all of the households were listed, and two households were selected at random. In each selected household, all of the household members who retained the right to vote were listed, namely those aged over 17 years or married.

If a female respondent was selected from one household, a male respondent would be selected from the other household. After listing male and female members of households, one person was selected at random to be interviewed face-to-face with the aid of the *kish grid*.

To ensure that the interview was actually conducted by the assigned interviewer, LSI carried out layered spot-checks as quality control. The initial spot-checks were carried out by the personsin-charge at the provincial level on 10% of the villages under his/her supervision. The next level of spot-checks were conducted by LSI researchers from the Jakarta office in 5 provinces selected at random. Spot-checks by LSI researchers were done in 10% of the villages in the selected provinces.

Detailed Results

The following charts show the results from the poll, along with comparisons with the results from identical questions asked in polls commissioned by the Pew Research Center in 2002 and 2003.

Q1: Some people think that suicide bombing and other forms of violence against civilian targets are justified in order to defend Islam from its enemies. Other people believe that, no matter what the reason, this kind of violence is never justified. Do you personally feel that this kind of violence is often justified to defend Islam, sometimes justified, rarely justified or never justified? Muslim-only respondents.

³ The results are also consistent with a late-2004 poll commissioned by the BBC in which 51% of Indonesians surveyed said that the United States had a "mainly negative" influence on the world; 38% said "mainly positive."
